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24 week baby with 510 gm weight – now a normal child

he extreme preterm baby who was born at 24 week with 510 gram weight is now an active normal infant. Baby Nafeesuthul Misriya, daughter of Smt Haseena, from Karunagappally, was born on 10 November 2018 at the Lifeline Super Speciality Hospital, Adoor, which offers tertiary care for the Mother and the New-born at par with international standards.

Dr Binu Govind, Consultant Neonatologist and Head of the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) of the Hospital (who was trained in CMC Vellore and worked as Assistant professor there) along with a team of doctors who are extensive-

ly trained in neonatal care, took care of the baby. Baby Nafeesuthul Misriya, now of above eight months, is healthy and does not have any major morbidity of prematurity. Since the baby was born 16 weeks before full term, she was given ventilator support and was provided best possible care in the NICU.

The NICU of the Lifeline Hospital has all sophisticated facilities to take care of the babies born extreme preterm who require sophisticated care. The NICU is the largest one in Kerala with bed strength of 60. The Lifeline is the only Hospital in Central Travancore specialised in treating extreme preterm babies

from 24 weeks of gestation (birth weight of 500 gm). The NICU of the Hospital has eight ventilators including two HFOV(VN500), six CPAP units along with facilities for whole body cooling, Laminar flow apparatus for preparing total parenteral nutrition (TPN), Invasive blood pressure monitoring and all other necessary high-tech monitors and equipment for proper neonatal care. It has in house Retinopathy of prematurity Screening (ROP), BERA for hearing analysis, developmental therapies for early stimulation and paediatric surgery back up for babies requiring surgery.

Removes 40 Fibroids from an Infertility Patient

A total of 40 fibroids were removed from an infertility patient at the Lifeline Hospital on 12 April 2019. The patient, who is working in Australia, is 38 years old. The surgery was led by a team of doctors consisting of Prof. Dr B Prasannakumari, Dr Cyriac Pappachan, Dr Jayaram Paniker, and Dr B Sreelatha. She was discharged in good health after three days and she was advised to try for pregnancy after six months.

Removes Thyroid with Retrosternal Extension

A large thyroid with retrosternal extension was operated in a 42 year old patient at the Lifeline Hospital on 22 April 2019. Retrosternal extension of thyroid is rare and is seen in only about 5 -7% of patients with enlarged thyroid. The surgery was led by a team of doctors consisting of Dr Mathews John and Dr Sheeja Varghese.



DNB in Gynaecology

The Lifeline Hospital has been recognised as an institute for DNB studies in Obstetrics and Gynaecology by the National Board of Examinations (NBE), since 2012. So far nine doctors have successfully completed the programme. Presently five doctors are doing studies under the Obstetrics and Gynaecology Department.

FOGSI Recognises Certificate Courses

The Federation of Obstetric and Gynaecological Society of India (FOGSI) has recognised the Hospital as a Centre for conducting Certificate Courses in Endoscopy, Advanced Gynaecological Endoscopy, and Infertility (Basic and Advanced), during the year 2015. So far 23 doctors have been trained by the Hospital.

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All about creating a healthy society

/ ith increasing number of diseases, both lifestyle and hereditary, many resort to early diagnosis so as to impede the development of any kind of ailment. A healthy child is an asset, both to the family as well as to the society, and the team at the Lifeline Super Specialty Hospital, Adoor, focuses on helping people to have children who are free from the risk of inheriting any sort of diseases. The hospital has been instrumental in facilitating safe gestation and parturition, focusing on key aspects of genetics and radically distinctive molecular diagnostic techniques in order to give disease-free children to the society. Reproductive Genetics and Cancer Solutions (RGCS), which is the latest addition to the hospital, is one of the premium next generation sequencing-based genomics company in India. RGCS offers extensive genetic testing, including reproductive genetics, cancer genomics, pharmacogenomics and wellness genetic testing.

According to Dr Mathew Pappachan, who is a fertility specialist and embryologist at the hospital and the founder of RGCS, the field of In vitro fertilization (IVF) has had an exponential growth. "Our lab concentrates on Reproductive genetics and it is one of the first of its kind in Kerala. Ethical micromanipulation is done not just in cases where couples have fertility issues but also for people who have hereditary diseases or those who are vulnerable to get them. When couples come for IVF treatment, they are not just investing to give birth to a baby but also towards a healthy future for the child. We have patients coming from different parts of the country and our mission is to detect and eliminate any form of disease or abnormality at the beginning stage," he said.

Dr Mathew did his MS in IVF from the US and later moved to Melbourne to do masters in embryology. He did his research on 'Pre-implantation Genetic Diagnosis'. "Pre-implantation genetic diagnosis involves detection of abnormalities or diseases before the embryo gets implanted on the uterine wall. There is nothing we can do after the embryo enters the uterus. Usually, when doctors

suspect some irregularities in the initial gestational period, an Amniocentesis is suggested between 16 to 20 weeks of pregnancy. According to the MTP (Medical Termination of Pregnancy) Act in India, an abortion is performed before 20 weeks of pregnancy and only in exceptional cases does the Court permit otherwise. Many couples are ignorant of the fact that they might be carriers of some genetic disorder or disease and sometimes late diagnosis of these disorders may result in the birth of an abnormal baby. Sometimes these diseases may skip a generation and make

its presence known in the next, so it is necessary to keep a tab on it. In our diagnosis, we collect embryos from the patients and a biopsy is performed on five-day old embryos. We decide on further procedures based on the results obtained. Our objective is to give healthy babies to our patients," he said.

One of the common genetic disorders in South India is Down's syndrome or trisomy 21 that occurs when a person has three copies of chromosome 21. Other common abnormalities include genetic translocation, a condition in which a broken segment from one chromosome is transferred or attaches to a non-homologous chromosome or a new site on the same chromosome; blood disorders like Thalassemia and sickle cell anaemia and SMA (spinal muscular atrophy) which affects the motor nerve cells. "These genetic disorders can be detected at the embryonic stage and it can be eliminated. I currently have patients from Madurai and Wayanad who are carriers of Thalassemia. They have been going through continuous abortions as the disorder is dominant in the embryo. Our team at Lifeline ensure that only healthy embryos are selected for the full gestation," Dr Mathew said.

RGCS also performs Cancer Genetic Testing which enables early detection of cancer or the chances of getting it. "Generally when there is a history of cancer in the family, there are chances that the future generation may exhibit a vulnerability to it. We mainly focus on prediction and early detection of lung, colon, breast and prostate cancer. We also suggest medication for it. You don't necessarily have to wait for signs or symptoms to do the test, anyone can come and do it," he added.

According to the Dr Mathew, the Lifeline hospital is one among the first pre-implantation genetic diagnostic centres in the country. After several years of research, RGCS has come up with highly sophisticated diagnostic techniques. Genetic tests are usually very expensive as before the samples were sent abroad for testing. But, now at RGCS the tests can be done in Kerala itself at a reduced cost. We have developed various kits for the convenience of the people. They can buy the kits and our agents will deliver the samples to the testing centre. We get samples from different parts of the country for testing and our centre strives hard to effectively test and deliver reports. Only in the case of IVF treatment or any other fertility related treatment, the patient has to be physically present at the hospital.

"Although there are some foreign companies in the country that perform Non-Invasive Prenatal Test, they send the sample abroad and it is analysed based on foreign data or foreign bioinformatics. At the Lifeline, we have analyses based on Indian bioinformatics and we test all the samples at our centre," Dr Mathew said. NIPT DAISY is instrumental in our pre-implantation diagnosis. The other methods are Embryo Screen and Carrier Genetics Testing.

Dr Pappachan Receives Distinguished Alumni Award

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RGCS offers gene testing for breast and ovarian cancer

eproductive Genetics and Cancer Solutions (RGCS), a sister concern of the Lifeline Hospital, offers a comprehensive gene testing for breast and ovarian cancer by its registered trademark named BRCAChek and BRCA PlusChek by using next generation sequencing technology from blood, saliva, FFPE slides etc. RGCS offers detailed genetic sequencing of BRCA1 and BRCA2 gene to identify the mutations. It can be used as a diagnostic or as a screening test for women/men with a family history of breast/ovarian cancer. Such revolu-


Breast cancer is becoming common in women both in rural and urban population. Breast cancer ranks as the number one cancer among Indian females with rate as high as 25.8 per 100.00 women and mortality of 12.7 per 100,00 women, as per the Indian health ministry. Breast

cancer mortality rates in India are 1.6 to 1.7 times higher than maternal mortality rates. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), breast cancer impacts over 1.5 million women each year. About 5-10% of breast cancers are thought to be hereditary, caused by gene mutations and can be passed from a parent to next generation and 8.5% of BRCA1 and 2.7% of BRCA2 mutations are the common cause of hereditary breast and ovarian cancer. By our new and innovative BRCAChek and BRCA PlusChek gene testing, these hereditary cancers can be detected early, thereby earlier initiation of treatment leads to longer survival and better outcome.

Micro-TESE: New Hope for Men with Low Sperm Count



raditionally, testicular sperm extraction (TESE) involves the removal of small pieces of testicular tissue; the tissue is then inspected for the presence of sperm. The use of a special microscope in Micro-TESE means that the amount of tissue required for sperm extraction is now much smaller. This

is because the doctor is able to identify tiny tubules which are most likely to contain sperm and remove these preferentially. With Micro-TESE, the probability of finding sperms is more than 60% which is twice as compared to a non-microsurgical procedure. It can be performed and timed with IVF or ICSI. The higher chances of obtaining quality sperms enhance the possibilities of a successful pregnancy.

This new procedure MICRO TESE is available in the Lifeline Hospital with a good 50% chance of sperm being successfully extracted.

Micro-TESE can be benefited the Couples planning for parenthood but facing the following male infertility issues. Non-obstructive Azoospermia - No sperms in the semen due to reduced production in the testes. Severe Oligoasthenozoospermia with high sperm DNA fragmentation - Very few and weak sperms in the semen with a high number of them with damaged DNA. Severe Oligo Teratozoospermia - Very few sperms in the semen with very few appearing normal.

Parenthood is the dream of every couple and infertility makes it difficult to achieve it. Infertility is often thought of as a female concern, but in about 50% of the cases, there is a concern with the male which must be addressed early. A complete lack of sperms (Azoospermia) occurs in about 10-15% of men who are infertile. Micro-surgical testicular sperm extraction offers hope to men who have no sperm in their ejaculate. The above technique is likely to be particularly beneficial for men with low sperm count or for those with small testes.

Dr Cyriac Receives Best Poster Award

Cyriac Pappachan received First Prize for Poster er Presentation for his poster entitled 'Minimally Invasive Management of Ovarian Torsion' at YUVA FOGSI South Zone 2019, held at Coimbatore.

The poster mentions that the Ovarian Torsion involves partial or complete rotation of the ovary on its ligamentous supports often leading to interruption of its blood supply and in some cases necrosis. It has been pointed out that ovarian torsion is a known cause of acute pelvic pain. It occurs in the prepubertal and postmenopausal women. Delay in diagnosis and management of Ovarian Torsion will compromise ovarian function and fertility. Prompt diagnosis is paramount to conserve ovarian and tubal function. The study concludes that laparoscopic approach can be the preferred route in all cases of adnexal torsion. Con-

servative approach to surgical management in the form of detorsion with or without oopheropexy should be attempted before oophorectomy. Whether or not to perform oopheropexy at the time of detorsion of normal adnexa is less clear. In recurrent torsion, oopheropexy (Hotdog in Bun Technique) with non-absorbable suture is shown to reduce recurrence rates.
